

The kernel of this project started in Brazil about six years ago in conversation with David Beaty. Our original idea never materialized, but the need for a publication of poetry by South Florida poets did — thus we have this new book, the first book that Tigertail has ever produced. Our community of poets has amassed a body of work that now needs to be disseminated in a public way. We are honored to have the involvement of Campbell McGrath. Campbell's name was central in that early conversation in Brazil. Each year there will be a
